Computer Voucher Program Launching Soon

The COVID-19 pandemic created challenges for many Colorado residents, particularly those who live with disabilities. In October, Connections for Independent Living will launch a program that will allow consumers in Weld, Logan, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, and Yuma Counties the opportunity to order and receive a new computer for their personal use.

This computer will allow the user to connect to Internet service, and use technology to join others in support groups. Through the use of the computer, the user obtains the ability to order food, medication, and supplies for home delivery. They can also attend online medical appointments, search for employment, and reduce isolation.

Program funding through the federal CARES Act allows for a maximum of \$350 to be applied to any computer order. There are a limited number of computers

available through this program, so those interested should respond to your Independent Living Specialist at Connections by mid-October for full details. Greeley Computer Services will activate the computers, and they will be available for pickup upon notification. For consumers

Consumers may choose to pay an additional amount at their own expense to the \$350 grant to receive a higher level computer. Software like Microsoft Office, Internet service, and associated monthly fees, are the responsibility of the consumer. All applicable sales taxes must also be paid by the consumer at the time of the order. Vouchers are not redeemable for cash, and no change is provided for orders valued at less than \$350. All computer sales are final, meaning that once the computer is delivered, it is the consumer's responsibility for any repairs and costs outside of warranty.

If you are interested in participating in this program, you must contact Connections for Independent Living beginning October 1. You may do so by telephone at 970-352-8682 to speak with your Independent Living Specialist, or by email message at **info@connections4il.org**. The consumer must have proven residency in the Connections service counties and be an active care consumer with Connections. Computer delivery will take up to two weeks from the date of the order.

A waiting list will be created if the maximum number of vouchers are distributed. Connections new TechMate program volunteers will begin in October, providing remote assistance by telephone for any technical questions about the new computers. Adding SSI/SSDI Benefits can Save a Life

Although many persons receive Social Security, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) from the federal government, there are individuals who haven't considered this assistance. Such income can assist in monthly living expenses, and save lives.

Within our seven-county region in northeastern Colorado, Connections recognizes there are individuals who are eligible for this financial assistance program, but have not yet explored the application process.

If you, or a family member or colleague, live with disabilities and do

not currently receive SSI/SSDI benefits, these programs are worth investigating. Connections offers a free assessment service for interested individuals to look into this process.

Through a call to Connections, you can schedule an evaluation with a trained SSI/SSDI benefit specialist. Our knowledgeable specialist can help you navigate the qualification process, and determine whether you are a candidate.
