Connections COVID-19 Vaccine Guidance Program Offers Assistance

Residents of northeastern Colorado who live with disabilities may find the process to register and schedule vaccinations for the COVID-19 virus to be challenging to complete. To provide guidance and assistance in this process, Connections for Independent Living has launched a free vaccine assistance program.

Many healthcare companies and organizations charged with the task of distributing the free vaccine have created waiting lists for interested persons. Health centers are primarily using online methods to schedule vaccination appointments.

Recognizing the challenges associated with online access to many persons

with disabilities, Connections' Independent Living Services team is available to provide guidance to consumers regarding the vaccination process. Team members adhere to strict confidentiality

agreements and all staff are subjected to background checks to assure safety of personal information. Team members from the Greeley nonprofit can immediately assist in registering and scheduling the vaccination. Free transportation to and from vaccine appointments can also be arranged.

Individuals who have an interest in working with Connections can call (970) 352-8682 weekdays during standard business hours to arrange a consultation. Like most services at Connections, this appointment is provided at no cost to qualifying area residents.

Connections Cares Program will Return this March

Our popular *Connections Cares* program, which ran for eight Friday sessions beginning in late October, 2020, will return in mid-March for additional weekly sessions.

Specifically created for persons who live with disabilities in northeastern Colorado who are also temporarily experiencing homelessness, the program provides critical support through distribution of complimentary pantry food boxes, along with personal protective gear for health. Connections Independent Living Specialists and Housing Specialists participate in the outdoor program, offering pre-intake assistance to persons new to our organization.

It is anticipated the program will again be hosted Fridays from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m. in the front entry plaza

outdoors at the Connections offices at 1331 8th Avenue in Greeley. Depending on weather, the team will erect a large green tent to provide some shelter from outside conditions.

There is also discussion about potentially offering a reduced version of the program in the weeks leading to the launch in mid-March. This is envisioned to provide free pantry food boxes to any registered Connections consumer in need. Curbside delivery of the boxes will offer low-risk accessibility to these pantry staples.

Colorado Gives Day Successful
