Joshua Fulenwider Joins Connections

Connections for Independent Living welcomes Joshua Fulenwider as our Director of Independent Living Services. The University of Northern Colorado graduate served as a member of our board of directors for two years prior to applying for the position.

"Connections for Independent Living is important to me because I have seen the barriers my cousin faced growing up and living with cerebral palsy," said Fulenwider. "The mission of Connections became so important to me that I jumped on the opportunity to become more involved. We've achieved so much, but there is still so much more that needs to be done."

Executive Director Rochelle Mitchell-Miller led the search for a director to manage and lead our largest department. "Josh had been an incredibly valuable board member during his tenure. His background in finance and business are huge assets to our agency," Mitchell-Miller said. "Although we will miss his contributions at the board level, I know our independent living team will appreciate his leadership, and his strong interest to provide assistance to our consumers, and I am grateful to have him as a leader full-time."

Tasked with the operational management of all Independent Living programs for Connections, Fulenwider supervises a team of seven specialists who work directly with the public. Fulenwider spent seven years with two Greeley-area banks serving customers. He also is well-connected with Weld County Chambers of Commerce, recreation groups and non-profit organizations.

Fulenwider considers providing assistance to persons who live with disabling conditions as a process to improve the lives of his northeastern Colorado neighbors. "Many of the things that the rest of the world takes for granted requires extra steps and/or navigating complicated governmental bureaucracy for those who live with disabilities," said Fulenwider. "I have become heavily invested in the peer-to-peer support system that Connections works with daily."

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Our Organization

Established in 1986, Connections for Independent Living is one of nine certified Independent Living Centers (ILCs) in the State of Colorado. We serve Weld, Morgan, Logan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, and Yuma Counties. All our services are free and voluntary for our valued consumers.

Connections Cares Resumes

Connections has resumed our weekly on-site Connections Cares program. It is designed for persons who live with disabilities in northeastern Colorado who have not been able to be fully accommodated by our remote and online services.

Continuing each Friday from 11:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m., trained independent living and housing specialists will be on hand at our Greeley office to provide personal assistance and guidance.



The program began in October to provide limited personal assistance to qualifying residents in a fully outdoor environment. After a winter hiatus, the program resumed with limited indoor services by appointment or by checking in at an outdoor tent.

Through the program, persons who live with disabling conditions can receive assistance in housing options, arranging for a COVID-19 vaccination, and determining if they qualify for SSI/SSDI financial benefits. In addition, complimentary pantry boxes of supplemental food will be available for residents of northeastern Colorado living with a disability who are in need, along with face masks for COVID-19 safety.

"Providing 97 percent of our services remotely for the past year has been widely successful, yet it does fall short on some in-person necessities," said Rochelle Mitchell-Miller, Executive Director. "Connections Cares gives a one-stop-shop for our highest demand in-person services and I am grateful to our innovative team for coming up with this solution for our community."

Computer Technology Program Offers Assistance

The State of Colorado Department of Human Services' *Communications Technology Program* provides communications resources and tools at no charge to qualified deaf, hard of hearing and deafblind persons.

Connections is an authorized demonstration center for this program. Available equipment includes amplified and captioned telephones, smartphones and tablets, along with ring signalers and neck loops, or headsets and specialized equipment. This technology provides an individual with access to family members, and to the community at large.

SOCIAL GROUP


