

Help Connections this December 7 through Colorado Gives Day

Give where you live. Colorado Gives Day, on Tuesday, December 7, has special meaning for Connections this year.

At the October 19 Greeley City Council meeting, the members approved the city's 2022 budget. The new budget includes a grant appropriation of \$11,200 for upcoming Connections infrastructure improvements.

Community Development Block Grant funds will provide a portion of the costs to reconstruct the Connections' office entry. Our goal is that private donations, including Colorado Gives Day and end-of-year donations, will hopefully cover the remainder of the planned construction expenses. We need your help to make this happen!

Connections will be removing the double door entry and reconstructing the front door to allow for easier access for persons who use chairs or canes for mobility. The automated door opener will be updated to allow more time, as well as adding a sensor to keep the door from closing unexpectedly. In addition, segments of the outside

sidewalk will be replaced and a new safety railing added. The latter will be especially helpful when the walk is slick with snow and ice.

The arrival of the pandemic in 2020 has led to greater social isolation for Coloradans who live with paralysis. Through the playing of online games, social isolation can be reduced and quality of life improved.

Modern gaming through the internet is designed for persons of all abilities. Technology and superior graphics provide a profound impact on the gaming experience, offering experiences that look and feel realistic. In many multi-person games, the gamer becomes part of a larger community of individuals.

This group teaches people how to advocate for themselves. Meets monthly, second Tuesday, from 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. Online.









COVID-19 Connections services update

Increasing hospitalizations and relatively low COVID-19 virus vaccination rates in northeastern Colorado greatly concern the Connections staff and board of directors.

Until hospitalizations decrease and vaccinations increase in our sevencounty service region, all in-person visits to our Connections offices will be by appointment only. Generally, appointments with team members may be scheduled on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. Visitors entering our building must wear face masks and practice social distancing, regardless of vaccination status.
